Programme/Course Description

Social democratic parties in Europe find themselves at a crossroad. Since Tony Blair and Gerhard Schröder led a revival of social-democratic parties in the early 2000s, the electoral fate of these parties has just worsened and some parties like the Dutch and the French ones, score below 10% of votes. This striking fact does not correspond with the historical importance of these parties. On the one hand, the very contemporary concept of political party appears with the first mass organizations of industrial workers who founded still-living social democratic parties like the German SPD or the Spanish PSOE. On the other hand, these parties that have played a central role in social changes like the enlargement of the electoral franchise, the construction of post-WWII welfare states and the foundation of the EU. Using both a historical and analytical perspective, this course analyses the crucial role of social democratic parties in Europe during the 20th century, as well as their challenges for the 21st century. Theoretically this course is embedded within the main contemporary theories of party competition.
